The Music Department is a busy and vibrant department at Caterham School. We host a number of concerts of all types; Chamber and soloist recitals, Musical Theatre Evenings, choral performances including services, large-scale orchestral concerts, informal and intimate Live Lounge acoustic sessions and much more. Concert tours abroad and around the UK, trips to performances, a range of visiting masterclasses and participation in community events, competitions and charity events add to the opportunities on offer.

Additionally, we actively promote the creation of new music and support musical composition and the art of sound recording and engineering.

FOR EXISTING MUSICIANS & SINGERS

Individual music lessons: Visiting Music Teachers (VMTs) will publish lesson times in advance on SOCs. If a pupil is required to miss an academic lesson, they should let their academic teacher know in-person or via email with at least 48 hours' notice. Pupils are withdrawn from their normal timetabled academic lessons on a rotational basis. Sixth Form pupils, any pupils receiving tuition on more than one instrument or pupils already missing class time for study support will where possible, have their lessons in free periods, lunchtimes or before/after school. These fixed lesson slots are limited and therefore cannot be offered to pupils unless they meet these criteria. The same applies to those pupils who learn an instrument and have LAMDA lessons. If a pupil is unable to attend a music lesson due to exams, sports events, trips, etc. or any other planned absence, they should please let their VMT know at least 24hrs in advance. As per the contract you have agreed with the VMT, without the required notice parents may be charged for lessons missed. Reports are written annually.

Insurance: It is strongly advised that parents take out insurance for their child's instrument. This may be possible as part of home insurance policies (but this should be confirmed). For specific musical instrument insurance providers such as [Allianz](#) will offer specialist cover.

Instrument storage and hire: All instruments must be stored in the storage room in the Dance Studio (ground floor of the Performing Arts Centre). Pupils must not leave instruments in corridors or classrooms. They should see a member of the music team to be given the code for the storage room. Pupils' instrument cases should always be clearly labelled with their name and tutor group.

Ensembles and rehearsals: The Music Department runs a busy schedule of rehearsals throughout the school week offering a full range of vocal and instrumental ensembles.

Inclusive Ensembles / Groups: We encourage pupils of all standards and abilities to participate in ensemble playing and singing. There is an expectation that members of all ensembles are committed, attend rehearsals regularly, and hold a high standard of rehearsal etiquette.

Auditioned / 'Invitation Only' Ensembles / Groups: there are particularly high expectations with regards to attendance, punctuality and preparation. Maturity towards the rehearsal etiquette and performances as well communication with the ensemble leader is also expected. Pupils may ask to audition for these ensembles or they may be invited to do so, with or without an audition. Details of the audition will be sent to individuals in advance. Pupils may be expected at additional rehearsals that may take place at weekends or evenings in preparation for performances. Pupils may be invited to participate in trips and concert tours abroad. Ensemble leaders reserve the right to review a pupil's place in the ensemble based on attendance and/or progression.

Music priority: Ensemble rehearsals take priority over other activities at the following times:

- Monday after school
- Thursday lunchtime
- Monday-Friday before school

If a pupil is a member of an ensemble that rehearses during these times and a clash arises, they should speak to a member of the music team.

CONCERTS

In general, concerts at Caterham School begin at 7.00pm with rehearsals taking place after school from 4.00pm. Occasionally, rehearsals will begin earlier in the afternoon. Pupils are usually expected back at the concert venue at 6.30pm when refreshments are served to parents/guardians/families. If pupils require dinner before an evening performance, it is usually possible to book this on Wisepay, the day before the performance at the latest.

Concert dress is smart, 'all-black' appropriate for formal concerts: plain black long-sleeved shirts and plain black trousers/skirts/dresses of an appropriate length (not bare shoulders). Shoes should be smart black and worn with black socks or tights. Should this dress code differ, pupils will be informed with plenty of notice. Hair should always be tidy and presentable.

We regularly use St John's Church in Caterham as an extension of our facilities. Parents may be asked to drop off/collect from the church and arrangements may differ from a normal 'in house' rehearsals or concerts. On occasion, pupils may walk to/from St John's Church.

Further information about concerts and events will be emailed to pupils and parents nearer the time and will include specific details.

Practice rooms: If pupils wish to practise their instrument during the school day, they should check with a member of the music team to find an available room. Boarders have an allocated practice time where they have access to the practice rooms, which is 4.00 – 6.00pm, seven days a week (excluding exeats and holidays).

Music Theory: Should a pupil need to have theory support in preparation for an exam, the department is pleased to offer sessions for grades 1-5 on Friday mornings at 8.00am. In addition, some VMTs will offer individual theory lessons charged at their usual lesson rate. For advice on entering theory exams (online) please contact Dr Brammeld (Head of Instrumental Music).

Exams and accompanying: Should a pupil wish to take an Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music or Trinity Musical Theatre music exam in school, the VMT will apply on their behalf. Should a pupil who learns outside school wish to take an exam in school, please contact Mrs Clark (Music Administrator), who may be able to arrange this for you. Should the exam require an accompanist, a VMT will be able to provide this at a charge and rehearsals will be arranged accordingly. (Please note, accompanists for school concerts and events are provided by members of the music team at no additional cost.)

Signing up for concerts: Invitations for pupils to perform in forthcoming concerts and events are usually announced in the school's weekly newsletter- please look out for these announcements.
